## Hurghada



### Giftun Island National Park

Enjoy an excursion of the Hurghada coast in a boat with lunch included. Cruise across the Red Sea to the uninhabited island of Giftun surrounded by magical coral gardens and spend time swimming in the turquoise water and walking along the white sandy beach. Trip to Giftun Island for snorkeling and view the Red Sea from a submarine before returning to hotel.



### Hurghada City Tour

## Sharm El Naga

## Cairo by Bus
